### Passport to History

The Delaware County Historical Society created its Passport to History® Program to Bring History to Life for children and their families across Southeastern Pennsylvania.

Children receive a passport that will grant free admission to the historical sites throughout the Brandywine Valley.



The sites include colonial homes, churches, mills, museums, and the Brandywine Battlefield Park.

As students make their journey to the sites designated on the map, they get their passports stamped. Schools will honor students with five stamps within a twelve month period with an award with prizes and certificates of achievement.

The Sun East Charitable Foundation endorses the continuing education of local history by funding the Brandywine Battlefield with a contribution of \$2,000 in 2014.

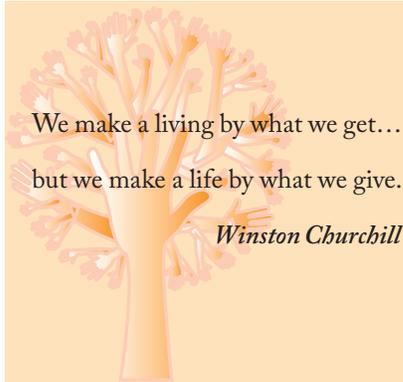
